MEDORRHINUM, CALCAREA PHOSPHORICA and **SILICEA** are remedies associated with growth and development.

Identify the most striking characteristics that would clearly differentiate between **TWO** of the three remedies in the treatment of the above.

OR

CARCINOSIN, SEPIA and **STAPHYSAGRIA** appear in the rubric “ailments from suppressed anger”.

Explain why **TWO** of the three remedies appear in this rubric. Clearly differentiate between them, focusing on their mental/emotional picture.

Section B

Answer **ONE** question
Total marks available 50.

KALI CARBONICUM and **TUBERCULINUM** are both in the rubric “obstinate, headstrong.” (*Synthesis*)

Explain why these two remedies appear in this rubric. Clearly differentiate between them in relation to the rubric, focusing on their physical, general and mental/emotional picture.

OR

PSORINUM and **SULPHUR** are *Psoric remedies*.

a) Discuss the ways in which the symptoms of these remedies reflect their miasmatic nature. (*35 marks*)

b) Define and differentiate between the features of the two remedies. (*15 marks*)
