Identify the most striking characteristics that would clearly differentiate between TWO of the three remedies in the treatment of the above.

## OR

CARCINOSIN, SEPIA and STAPHYSAGRIA appear in the rubric "ailments from suppressed anger".

Explain why TWO of the three remedies appear in this rubric. Clearly differentiate between them, focusing on their mental/emotional picture.

## Section B

Answer ONE question Total marks available 50.

KALI CARBONICUM and TUBERCULINUM are both in the rubric "obstinate, headstrong." (Synthesis)

Explain why these two remedies appear in this rubric. Clearly differentiate between them in relation to the rubric, focusing on their physical, general and mental/emotional picture.

## OR

PSORINUM and SULPHUR are Psoric remedies.
a) Discuss the ways in which the symptoms of these remedies reflect their miasmatic nature. (35 marks)
b) Define and differentiate between the features of the two remedies. (15 marks)
